## **A Better Way: Conflict Resolution**

## <u>Connect</u>

Who is a person you have seen handle conflict well? What impressed you about how they handled it?

## **Study**

- 1. Read **1 Corinthians 6:1.** What is specific thing is happening in the church of Corinth that is causing Paul to write this passage? Are these conflicts "criminal" or minor? Why is that distinction important?
- 2. Paul offers 4 reminders *why* this shouldn't be happening in the church. What is the 1<sup>st</sup> thing he reminds them of according to **v. 1 & vv. 9-11**? What does our new identity in Christ mean for how we are to live? Explain why this is different from "works righteousness." Where is this present in your life?
- 3. Read **1 Corinthians 6:2-4.** What is the 2<sup>nd</sup> reminder Paul gives the Corinthians? What is the difference between judging and being judgmental? How is this hard for you?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 6:5-6.** What is the 3<sup>rd</sup> reminder Paul gives as to why this way of dealing with conflict in the church is not acceptable? How is our handling of conflict a witness?
- 5. **Read 1 Corinthians 6:7-8.** What 4<sup>th</sup> reminder does Paul give? Do you view your faith as an individual matter (between "Jesus and me") or communal? What might change if we thought more like a family?
- 6. How do you normally handle conflict? What does Jesus say about handling conflict in **Matthew 18:15-17?** What does it look like to "speak the truth in love" to someone?
- 7. Why is it so difficult to "turn the other cheek" (cf. Matthew 5:38-40)? When is a time you have practiced this and what did you notice? Are there situations when this is *not* the right thing to do? Explain.
- 8. What action is the Spirit prompting you to pursue as a result of this passage?
