- b. What words would you describe checking out?
- c. Hanging Out?
- d. What words would you use to describe Jesus and the culture of calling people in and up to something better than they are currently experiencing.

Study

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 4:14-21.
- 2. Did anything stand out to you in the message clarifying, confusing, confirming?
- 3. As you look at the matrix again on the back of this paper, can you identify with any of these ways of relating to people? Does the way you relate change from children, marriage, workplace, small group, church setting?
- 4. Have you experienced a healthy Call-In culture in the past? What was it like? What are some of the elements of this culture you can identify? Who was responsible for creating this culture full of grace and truth? What can you learn from her/him?
- 5. **Read John 8:2-11** as an example of Jesus practicing grace and truth.
- 6. What do you notice about this story using the tool?
- 7. How does Jesus connect with and empower people?
- 8. What about his posture catches your attention?
- 9. What would it sound like if Jesus responded to the crowd or the woman in a Call-Out way? What about a Hang-Out way?
