What is something you have built or seen that was impressive? Why was it impressive?

<u>Study</u>

For this week's questions, we are going to try a different form for the questions. We have done it before, but it has been a while. The idea is to have everyone share what God is teaching you and what He wants you to do about it.

1. Read 1 Corinthians 3:10-23.

- 2. Summarize the message in your words. See if you can state the main idea in one sentence. Give everyone a chance to do this. Is there anything you are confused about or want more clarity? Make sure everyone is on the same page in the conversation.
- 3. What stuck out to you from the text or the message? Why? Be as specific and concrete as you can.
- 4. What is a lie or bad news that you may believe or trust tied to what stuck out to you? This bad news is typically misalignment to what God wants for us, and often feels burdening or like bondage. (An example: "I cannot love my family well because of our disagreements and we're not united") Where in your life do you see this?
- 5. What does the message or the text give you as truth or good news combats the bad news? (An example: "Jesus loves us despite us disagreeing with Him, and can help me do the same.")
- 6. How do you incorporate and respond to the good news in your life? What is God asking you to do this week?
