## A Better Way: The Spirit Of God

1 Corinthians 2:6-16 Life Group Questions – March 4, 2018



## **Connect**

Of the 5 senses (sight, smell, taste, touch, hearing), which one do you notice the most?

## <u>Study</u>

- 1. Corinthians loved knowledge; what they called "wisdom." (see **1 Cor. 1:22**). They saw knowledge as power. Discuss ways we Americans pursue knowledge today.
- 2. **Read 1 Corinthians 2:6-8**. God's wisdom, however, is <u>not</u> the wisdom of this age. What can result (why does it matter) if people don't understand God's wisdom?
- 3. **Read 1 Corinthians 2:9.** Human knowledge/wisdom = what we can know with our 5 senses. Such knowledge is a blessing, but it has limits. What does verse 9 tell us we will <u>miss</u> if we trust only what we can see, hear and conceive with our minds?
- 4. **Read 1 Corinthians 2:10-15.** Ten times in these verses Paul mentions the Spirit (of God). How do these verses tell us the Spirit helps us live the Christian life?
- 5. On the back of this week's message notes, you'll find more about the Holy Spirit. Take time to review this, then share what you appreciate about the Spirit of God.
- 6. How does a person <u>without</u> the Spirit (vs 14) respond to what the Spirit has to share? Have a friend, family member, classmate, co-worker who thinks Christianity's foolish?
- 7. Last week we learned: the wisdom of God = Christ crucified on the cross. (cf. 1 Cor. 1:18,23; 2:2). The Holy Spirit helps us understand all that the cross means. What does Jesus' dying on the cross mean to you personally?
- 8. **Read 1 Corinthians 2:16.** The Holy Spirit gives us "*the mind of Christ.*" Paul says having the mind (or mindset) of Christ will impact how we treat each other (read **Philippians 2:1-8** and list how we will act if we have "*the mind of Christ*"?
- 9. Is receiving the Spirit of God (if we have), meant to make us proud or humble? Why?

## <u>Pray</u>

In prayer, <u>practice conscious dependence</u> & <u>gratitude</u>. **Admit** the limits of your own human wisdom. **Affirm** your need for the Holy Spirit. [NOTE: If you know you don't yet have His Spirit, ask Him to give you His Holy Spirit (Luke 11:13).] **Thank** the Holy Spirit for opening your eyes and empowering you to live the Christian life. This week, pray often, "*Help me, Holy Spirit, to know & love Jesus.*"
