Transformed, Not Conformed: Treasure Management

Matthew 6:19-21 Life Group Questions – February 4, 2018

Connect

Name one of your favorite material possessions, and why you've enjoyed it.

Study

- 1. Review Jesus' vision for us who follow Him (**Matthew 5:14-16; Romans 12:2**). List reasons why it's easy for us to be influenced & conformed to the world instead.
- 2. Last week, we learned that everything we have belongs to God and that a *steward* is someone who looks after another person's property. What lessons are you learning about being God's steward—share how it's going for you.
- 3. **Read Matthew 6:19-20**. Jesus describes 2 investment plans, 2 ways we can steward the treasures He's entrusted to us. What's He say to do and not do?
- 4. **Read Luke 12:15-21.** In Jesus' parable, what question did the man ask, and how did he <u>think</u> of his possessions? What did God call him & why? **Read 2 Corinthians 8:1-5.** How did the Macedonian Christians <u>think</u> of their possessions, and what question do you imagine they asked? Who did they give themselves to (vs. 5)?
- 5. How do we store up "treasures in heaven" (see Luke 12:33; 1 Timothy 6:17-19)?
- 6. **Read Matthew 6:21**. In Ecclesiastes, we learned God wants us to <u>enjoy</u> His good gifts but not to <u>attach</u> our heart to them. Where's your heart when you store up treasures on earth? When you store up treasures in heaven? Why does this matter?
- 7. What did you find most helpful in the message? What questions did it prompt?
- 8. Share with the group one way you want to store up treasure in heaven this week. As a group, how can you band together to store up treasure in heaven now?

Pray

Like the Macedonian Christians: **a)** give yourself first to the Lord in fresh surrender; **b)** ask God to renew your minds, so you can ask better questions as you look at the money and possessions He's entrusted to you; **c)** ask Him to help you see eternal opportunities.
