The Life of Christ: Our Most Immediate Need

Luke 5:17-26

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◆ Jesus \_\_\_\_\_ with authority and had \_\_\_\_\_ many.

## Pharisees and Teachers of the Law:

One day Jesus was teaching, and Pharisees and teachers of the law were sitting there. They had come from every village of Galilee and from Judea and Jerusalem. And the power of the Lord was with Jesus to heal the sick. *Luke 5:17*

- God’s wisdom, I worry.

- That God is in control, I try to grasp at things instead of trust Him.
- God’s grace (a gift given freely to me), I think I can earn God’s love by how hard I work for Him.
- God’s grace, I think God owes me.
- God’s mercy (not getting what I deserve), I get resentful of others.
- God’s forgiveness, I don’t forgive others.
- God’s patience with me, I get impatient towards my kids, wife and others.
- God’s goodness, I think He is holding out on me.
- God’s love, I don’t love others the way He wants me to.
- God’s kindness, I view Him as big brother waiting to hammer me.
- How God disciplines me, I discipline my children inappropriately and use power, manipulation, fear, guilt and shame to get them to do what I want.
- God doesn’t hold my sin over my head, I hold on to grudges.
- That only God satisfies, I turn to idols.
- God’s faithfulness in the past, I don’t think He wants to answer my prayers or wants to be involved in my life now.
- God’s humility, I believe power is the way to accomplish things.
- God never gave up on me, I give up on praying for lost family members and friends.
- God wants me to talk to him and ask for Help, I come up with my own clever plans.
